



Resolution on Western Sahara

The III EL Congress reiterates its active solidarity with the Saharawi people caught in an unfinished process of decolonisation.

Western Sahara, one of the non-independent territories of the world under auspices of the United Nations, which has not concluded its decolonization process, is militarily occupied by the Kingdom of Morocco. The occupying power brings Moroccan settlers in order to threaten the population and the cultural integrity of Saharawi people and permits the plundering of their natural resources.

The terrible events that took place with the criminal dissolution of the Dignity Camp in the outskirts of El Aaiun, and the refusal of the occupying Moroccan forces to permit access to the media, international observers and European public representatives, obliges us to intensify our solidarity. On one hand we must report in all our countries on the criminal repression against the Saharawi people, and on the other, we must demand that the Spanish government fulfil its responsibility in the administration of the decolonization process. Therefore, the EU must assume an active role in the monitoring of this process.

We denounce the silence of the Spanish government and the EU in view of the violence exercised by Moroccan forces in the occupied territories.

We urge the European Council to freeze the EU- Morocco Association agreement as the Kingdom of Morocco has not complied with clause 2 on human rights.

Regarding the EU-Morocco Fisheries agreement we will insist, as we did with the current one, that the Agreement does not include Saharawi territorial waters, in application of International Law, as these waters do not belong to Morocco.

We demand that the United Nations mission (MINURSO) assume the observance of human rights in the occupied territories.

The EL Congress unanimously and urgently demands the fulfilment of UN Security Council resolution 1514 to hold a referendum on self-determination for the Saharawi people.
