

## **ADOPTED MOTION**

### **Change of EL Statutes**

Taking into account the report of the European Left's Statutes Commission and reflecting the debate within EL Member parties about submitted and proposed changes towards the EL Statutes, adopted at the ROME EL founding Congress 2004, the Executive Board proposes following changes. These proposals express the reached consensus on the Articles to be changed respectively paragraphs of the valid EL statutes.

#### **(1) Change of Article 4**

To add in the list of name in the official languages of the states where EL member parties exist:

- "Partidul Stîngii Europene" or "Stînga Europeana" or "SE" in Moldovan respectively in Romanian languages,
- "Avrupa Sol Partisi" or "Avrupa Sol" or "ASP" in Turkish language.

#### **(2) Change of Article 6**

the current Article 6, paragraph 7

*"The EL introduces for a certain period of experimentation the opportunity of individual membership as a contribution to its future development. A final decision on that issue will be taken only after a thorough debate of the experience and debates in all member parties. During that period each member party or political organization is free to adopt - for its own country - the most convenient approach and practical methods. According to that approach women and men residents of an EU member state can become individual members of the EL. In countries where full-right member parties or political organizations exist they can form friendship circles associated to these parties of the European Left. Citizens of other European countries associated to the EU can also apply for individual membership. They can join or create a national group of individual members applying for observer status in the EL.*

to change as following: (7):

"The EL introduces the opportunity of individual membership as a contribution to its future development. In countries where full-right member parties or political organizations exist each member party or political organization is free to decide to carry out this opportunity and to adopt - for its own country - the most convenient approach and practical methods. According to that approach women and men residents of an EU member state can become individual

Citizens of other European countries associated to the EU can also apply for individual membership.
